Uintalands owners: Please stay current this year on fire danger and restrictions. Board members will post wildfire information, changing restrictions, and warnings in three places throughout the spring and summer: this website, the Uintalands Association Members Facebook page, and warnings posted on the three gates.

Precautions to keep in mind at all times, no matter the level of fire restrictions:

- No incendiary targets at the firing range.*
- The firing range may be closed if fire danger is high. Notices will be posted.*
- Thoroughly douse all fires built in approved fire pits. Never leave them unattended.*
- Have an evacuation plan in place and make sure all your cabin guests know about it.*
- Tips to make your cabin more "fire-wise" will be coming soon.*

Reminder:

All UTV's, 4 Wheelers, and Motorcycles MUST have a lot tag attached. If you don't have one, please purchase one from the caretaker. This applies to your visitors as well.

Also, there is absolutely NO irrigation allowed.
